Emergency physicians are mandated by law to provide care to all patients who walk through their doors, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay. It's a mission we are proud of. Illinoisans who must visit the emergency department but lack the ability to pay still deserve high-quality, timely care.

However, recent rises in the percentage of patients who lack the ability to pay is straining hospitals and physician group's ability to provide high-quality care by board-certified emergency physicians 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Increasing Medicaid reimbursement for emergency medicine specialists will ensure that everyone in the state of Illinois receives high-quality emergency care into the future.
